WELFARE ACTIVITIES BY ATOMIC POWER PLANT

will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the welfare activities being undertaken by the Narora Atomic Power Plant as a part of its Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) and the funds spent on such activities during the last three years and the current year, year-wise;
- (b) whether any direct or indirect employment has been provided by the plant authorities and the plant based industries to the local people; and
- (c) if so, the details thereof along with the number of local persons working in the plant as on date, cadre-wise?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR PERSONNEL, PUBLIC GRIEVANCES & PENSIONS AND PRIME MINISTER'S OFFICE (DR.JITENDRA SINGH):

- (a) The Narora Atomic Power Station (NAPS) carries out welfare activities in the surrounding areas in the fields of health, education and infrastructure as a part of its Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR). Various activities in this regard are as below:
 - Health Care:
 - Organising free eye camps,
 - Free treatment and medicines to the nearby villagers
 - Emergency/ first aid care to members of the public around the power station in case of casualty.
 - Education:
 - Free education along with books, study material
 - Talent nurturing program
 - Distribution of uniform to nearby government school students

➤ Infrastructure development:

- Construction of baraat-ghar
- Approach road to villages
- Additional class-rooms construction in schools
- Construction of toilets, boundary-walls, earth filling of playgrounds in schools etc.

Funds spent on CSR activities during the last three year and current year by NAPS is given below:

Year	Expenditure in lakhs
2011-12	125.83
2012-13	60.75
2013-14	57.86
2014-15	in progress

In addition ₹ 16.45 lakh was also spent during the combined tenure of 2012-2014.

(c) Out of the total 971 employees at NAPS, 547 employees belong to the home district/ adjacent districts; and 772 employees belong to the home state. The details of these local persons working, cadre-wise is as given below:
